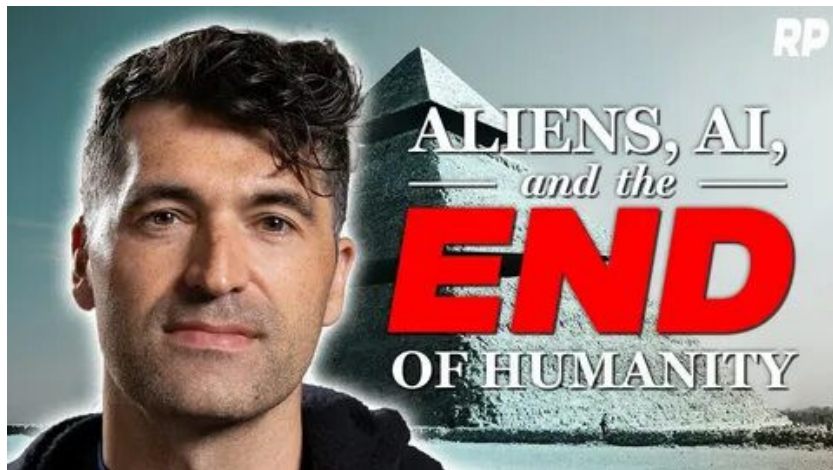


# The Next Round of Faking in Physics
